

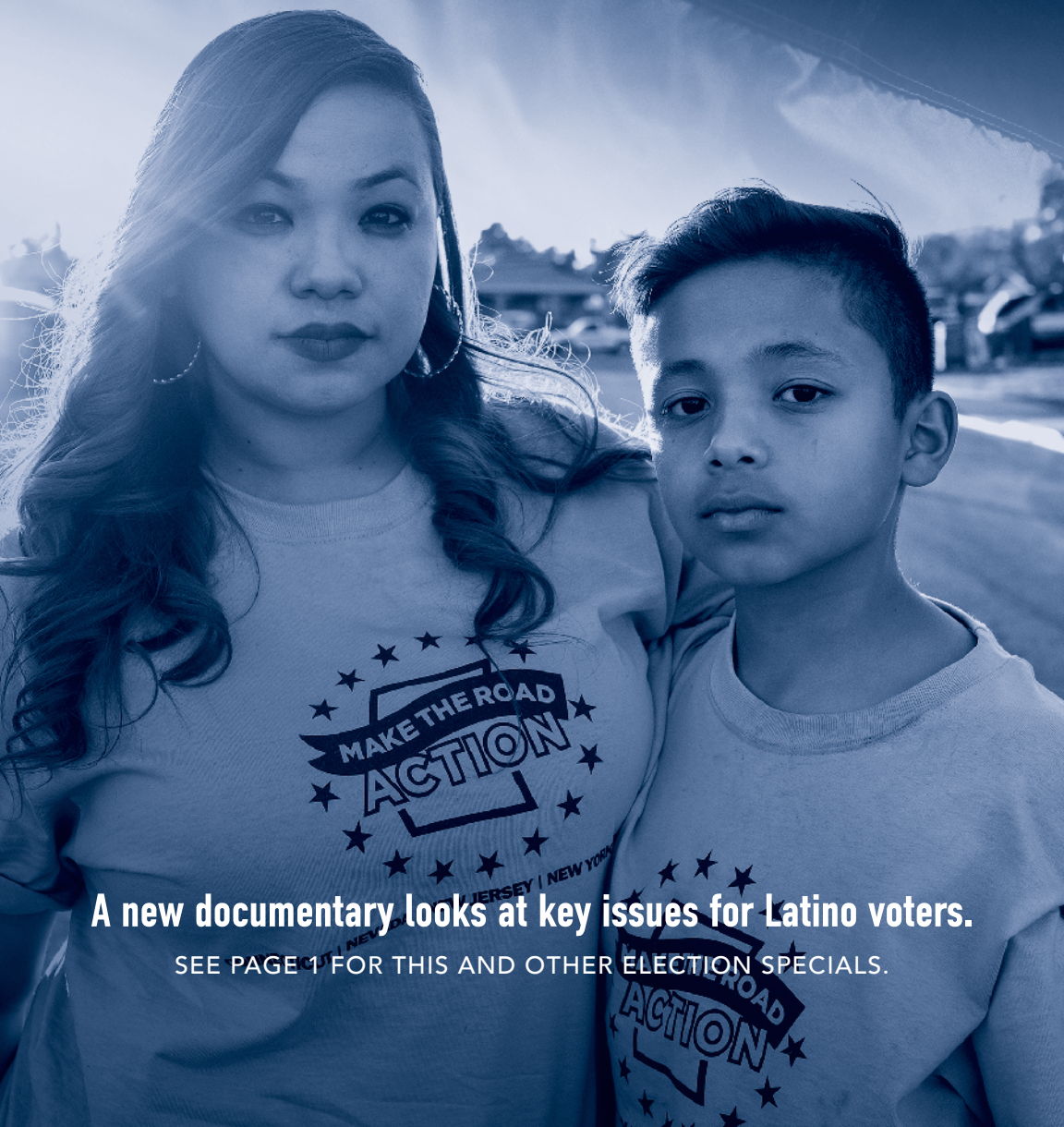

Reaching Latino voters in 2024

A new one-hour documentary will focus on the key issues driving Latino voter turnout in some of the most hotly contested battleground states, including Arizona, Florida, Nevada, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin. A joint production of PBS SoCal and Latino Public Broadcasting, **Voces: Latino Vote 2024** also delves into the efforts both political parties are making to reach the Latino electorate in California, the state with the largest Hispanic/Latino population in the country. Viewers will gain a deeper understanding of the impact of the changing demographics of America and the issues and concerns of Latino voters. The film will air at 9 pm Tuesday, Oct. 22. In addition, six digital shorts will focus on the experiences of young, first-time Latino voters.

The role of the vice president, the VP debate and candidates

What happens when the President of the United States is unable to fulfill the duties of the office due to illness, incapacity, or death? Incredibly, it is a question that went without a definitive answer for much of American history. **American Experience** presents the little-known story of the second-highest office in the land. **The American Vice President** focuses on the fraught period between 1963 and 1974 and offers a fresh and surprising perspective on succession in the executive branch. The film airs at 7 pm Tuesday, Oct. 1, just prior to the expected vice presidential debate.

On Tuesday, Oct. 8, **Frontline** investigates the lives and views of JD Vance and Tim Walz as they run for vice president. In an historic election, those who know the candidates best reveal the influences and ideas they'd bring to the White House. **Frontline: The VP Choice: Vance vs. Walz** premieres at 9 pm Tuesday, Oct. 8.

How have voters changed since 2020?

Frontline follows the changing views and experiences of Americans from the 2020 election to today in **American Voices 2024**. Filmmakers return to voters filmed four years ago to see how their hopes and fears have changed amid another polarizing election season. **American Voices 2024** airs at 9 pm Tuesday, Oct. 29.

POV films bring fresh perspectives

POV premieres three independent films this month, airing Mondays at 9 pm.

In the Rearview (Oct. 7) offers us a seat in director Maciek Hamela's volunteer aid van as it crisscrosses the roads of Ukraine to transport uprooted Ukrainian refugees safely to Poland. The film is an authentic, intimate observation of war as it unfolds.

Twice Colonized (Oct. 14) is an intimate look at a personal journey of renowned Inuit lawyer Aaju Peter, who has led a lifelong fight for the rights of her people, as she tries to mend her own wounds after the unexpected passing of her son.

Shot with a mix of smartphones and GoPros, **Tokyo Uber Blues** (Oct. 21) offers the first-person perspective of filmmaker Taku Aoyagi as he takes us on his daily bike rides as an Uber Eats worker.

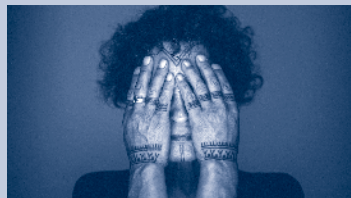

Training for the workforce of the future

The jobs that many of us will be doing in 10 years likely don't even exist yet. How can you adapt to the future without losing sight of yourself?

Roadtrip Nation: Skill Shift follows four people hoping to answer that question as they balance their personal evolution with the rapidly shifting needs of the workforce. Along the way, they meet with inspiring professionals pursuing careers where constant curiosity and skill acquisition are part of the job description. **Roadtrip Nation: Skill Shift** airs at 10 pm Monday, Oct. 21.



Visit a typewriter repair shop on 'Prairie Fire'

This month, **Prairie Fire** will introduce you to Lucas Dul, one of the youngest typewriter repair professionals in the United States —



and possibly the world. His fascination with typewriters began when he was a young boy growing up in the Chicago suburbs. He loved the way old typewriters sounded, their switches, their mechanisms, and the art of different typefaces. Today, he owns and is the sole employee at Typewriter Chicago, a typewriter repair shop located in Downers Grove. The shop also is part typewriter museum. (He encourages customers to type on them!) The typewriter collection features machines from nearly all eras since typewriters were invented, as well as one given to him by actor Tom Hanks. Other segments will be announced. **Prairie Fire** airs at 7:30 pm Thursday, Oct. 17.

Follow the ultimate teen civics competition

Citizen Nation is an innovative new documentary series that follows teenagers from across the U.S. with diverse personal and political backgrounds as they come together to compete in the nation's premier civic competition, "We The People." Airing Tuesdays at 8 pm beginning Oct. 8, the series shadows high school students over 10 months across eight states as they grapple with critical questions about democracy. As they rise through regional and state competitions, they respond to judges' challenges in the style of Congressional hearings and reveal their knowledge of the U.S. Constitution and politics, wrestling with what it means to be a citizen today. The four-part series culminates with the championship in the nation's capital.

Gorilla conservation effort documented

Wildlife cinematographer Vianet Djenguët fulfills his dream of embedding himself within a wild gorilla troop in **Silverback**, the first episode of season 43 of **Nature**. He joins Kahuzi-Biega National Park rangers in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. The result is this observational documentary as he documents a grueling but critical

conservation effort to habituate a family of Eastern lowland gorillas, in an attempt to save the critically endangered sub-species from extinction. **Silverback** airs at 7 pm Wednesday, Oct. 23.

As you prepare for the Nov. 5 election, remember that Illinois Public Media is your trusted source for the latest information on candidates and issues.

Listen to news updates and interviews on WILL-AM 580 from now until Election Day, and visit the Illinois Public Media Election 2024 Headquarters online at ipmnewsroom.org/election2024 to stay up-to-date on national, state, and local races. The website includes a voting guide for important dates, candidates, and ballot measures; a "Find Out What's on Your Ballot" feature, and more. The site will be updated frequently with stories from IPM News, including candidate interviews and election news to empower voters to cast a vote based on facts.

The election center also includes interviews from our statewide weekday talk show, **The 21st Show**, which airs Monday-Friday at 11 am on WILL-AM 580 and weekdays at 6 pm on WILL-FM 90.9. In addition to hosting **The 21st Show**, Brian Mackey is a veteran politics reporter. The Illinois Public Media Election Headquarters gives you instant access to his interviews with statewide office seekers.

On election night, we will have national coverage from NPR and PBS. Look for hourly updates on WILL-TV and radio, and streaming online.

Clements, Hardwick honored with local NAACP awards

Illinois Public Media's Jill Clements and Reginald Hardwick are among the six community members that were honored on Sept. 28 at the Hilton Garden Inn during the NAACP's Champaign County branch's annual Freedom Fund celebration.

Clements was honored with the Media Trailblazer Award. She was honored as one of the leaders that launched Illinois Soul, FM 101.1. The station was lauded for amplifying Black voices and culture, along with R&B music throughout central Illinois and online, with the power of public media. Clements, who is now station manager for Illinois Soul and a native of Champaign, led the development of the groundbreaking venture.

Hardwick, Illinois Public Media's director of news and public affairs, was honored with the Media Expansion Award. He was also a driving force behind the launch of Illinois Soul, which Hardwick says is "reaching and representing Black communities over the air in Champaign County in a way that was long overdue." Hardwick has won seven regional Emmy awards, and he says he is intent on building a news team that is "smart, diverse, and empathetic."

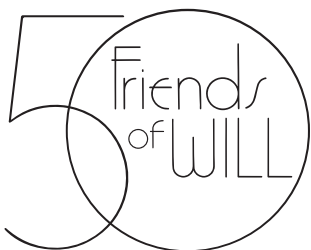

A. It's important to give because it's a way to help further the lifespan of any organization or establishment.

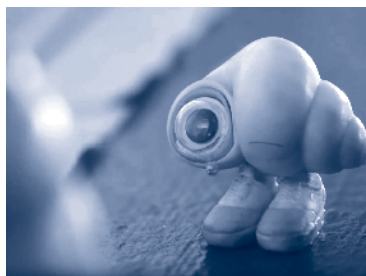
Giving is truly not about the money it's about being a helping hand to whatever cause you want to see prosper.

He earned a master's degree in government from Harvard University and a bachelor's in communications from the University of Wisconsin. He is pursuing a Ph.D. in media psychology at Fielding Graduate University.
